Latino Youth Peace & Leadership Conference

The topic for this year's 14th annual Peace and Leadership Conference was "Cultivando Mi Bienestar—Cultivating My Well-being", which encouraged students to live healthy lifestyles, physically and emotionally. On May 9, 166 students and 89 adult chaperones and guests attended the conference at Augsburg College; 21 youth leaders planned and led the event. Early Literacy and Hennepin County Library Collaboration

To benefit the many young children who accompany their parents to La Oportunidad's Padres program, we developed a structured literacy curriculum that promotes the value of reading and boosts literary skills of young readers ages 4-12. The Minneapolis Foundation found that only 41% of Latino students in Minneapolis enter kindergarten prepared. Additionally, the academic achievement gaps between Latino and white Minneapolis students remain prominent. Only 48% of Latino third graders are proficient in reading compared to 91% of whites. Through book-centered activities, crafts, games, writing exercises and drama, the Early Literacy Program aims to help Latino children gain reading proficiency by 3rd grade.

This year, La Oportunidad began a new collaboration with Hennepin County Libraries. Padres participants are introduced to the resources available at libraries and are informed on the value of checking out books and reading to their children. La Oportunidad's El Camino programs have hosted puppet shows and art displays at library branches. We're happy to promote the value of reading through this collaboration with Hennepin County Library!
